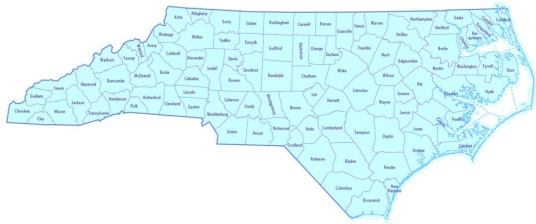


# Illicit Fentanyl Kills in all 100 Counties

## Fentanyl Kills...

- Infants & Toddlers in their own home & cars
- Middle & High Schoolers with counterfeit pills
- Young Adults with undisclosed fentanyl additives in party drugs & drinks
- Those with SUD get undisclosed fentanyl additives in their 'daily drug of choice.'

Children & middle/high schoolers must be informed about prevalence of deadly illicit fentanyl additives in counterfeit pills in NC!

Life saving Naloxone/Narcan should be in every school and public space...just like fire extinguishers!

Fentanyl victim families should be speakers in NC Recovery & Drug Diversion Courts, in schools and at community events.

## Advocacy & Support Fentanyl Victim Families

17,212 NC residents lost their lives to illicit fentanyl 2013-September 2023 (NC OCME 2024)

Those deaths create over 75,000+ grieving NC residents who have no support system in place to process their pain.

## Justice for Fentanyl Victims

Investigate all medication & drug toxicity deaths as homicides immediately. Include on-scene witnesses, cell phones, financial transactions via apps.

Develop NC statewide law enforcement training module & investigation 'best practices' for suspicious deaths involving fentanyl or medication/toxicity deaths.

Develop training module for District Attorneys and ADAs to consistently prosecute fentanyl homicides with GS 14-18.4 Death by Distribution
